## Preserving Campmeeting Trees for the Future – Update

The Board of Managers is committed to preserving Campmeeting's unique tree canopy through a program that includes planting new trees, fertilizing trees to increase their health, and protecting trees from insects and diseases.

We anticipate that several stumps will be ground out this spring and the ground prepared for new plantings. Soil tests are underway. Once we have those results, we will be able to choose the best species of tree for the particular soil.

Last year, we began treating our grove's ash trees, some of which have been damaged by the Emerald Ash Borer, an invasive pest that has decimated ash trees in Michigan, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois and Maryland. While some of our trees were judged to be rife with EAB, others are being protected through a program of trunk injections, soil treatments and trunk sprays. Soil treatment will occur around the end of March depending upon the weather.

We also are contending with another invasive pest—the Hemlock Woolly Adelgid, which is a tiny insect that feeds at the bases of hemlock needles. Hemlocks that are under stress are particularly vulnerable to the adelgid and can die in as few as 5 years.

Last fall, arborist Bob Houser sprayed many of our smaller Hemlocks (40 feet and under) with horticultural oil. In late April, he plans to spray the trunks of the larger Hemlocks with an insecticide that is very effective against adelgid and foliar feeding scale insects.

### **From the desk of the Superintendent of Grounds...**

Spring is here which means Campmeeting resident clean up, but before I launch into all of the seasonal reminders a quick thank you. On January 23<sup>rd</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup>, Mount Gretna experienced a historic snowfall. Depending on exactly where I was in the Campmeeting, snowfall totals ranged from 36 to 44 inches. The thank you is for all the support and words of encouragement from residents as I tried to open up parking lots and streets throughout the Campmeeting.

Now for the seasonal reminders. When placing piles from raking next to the street, please be sure to separate leaves from branches

and limbs. Leaves are picked up at the end of each season by West Cornwall Township as part of the services paid for by our local taxes. Limbs and branches are taken to the Lebanon Land Fill at a fee of \$30 per ton which is part of your yearly Association fee.

Throughout the spring and summer seasons Climb High Tree Service will be removing dead trees and grinding stumps. If you have a dead tree on or near your property which needs to be removed, do not hesitate to contact me with your concern.

There are three projects in the planning stages in the Campmeeting. Bids are being gathered to repave Markwood Avenue and some of the walking paths throughout the Campmeeting. Calendar year 2017 will be the 125th anniversary of the Tabernacle. To prepare for celebrations scheduled for next year, paint and restoration bids are being submitted for the Tabernacle. Hopefully work will be started immediately after Labor Day of this year. The third project that most residents will not notice is the draining, inspection, and painting of our water tank on Bell Avenue.

Residents living near the church parking lot who have grown accustomed to placing garbage in a storage bin behind the church will notice a sign informing you that this practice is no longer an option. The church has asked that I inform all residents to refrain from dumping trash behind the church. Place your trash in front of your cottage. TNT Sanitation will pick up your trash on Monday if it is visible to them – even on the walking streets.

As an FYI, Saturday, April 30 and Sunday, May 1 will be the dates of the annual Tour de Gretna Bicycle race. Promoters of the race have asked that I warn people of traffic disruptions on these days. Access to route 117 will be impacted on both days as will traffic on Mine Road and Butler Road. If you have any questions you may access their website at [TourdeGretna.com](http://TourdeGretna.com).

### **Board Approves Revised Building Permit Application**

Campmeeting members should be advised that a revised Building Permit Application is now in place for exterior renovations.

As a reminder to all MGCA members, an MGCA Building Permit Application MUST be submitted to the MGCA Board of Managers for approval as delineated in the most recent Rules & Regulations (R&R) handbook and/or as required by the Lebanon County Planning Department (LCPD) and West Cornwall Township (WCT).

Additional information is available in the new “MGCA Building Permit Information” Sheet that is available on the MGCA website, MtGretnaCampmeeting.com, or from the office at 717-964-2074.

The Board of Managers recommends that before starting any renovations to their property, Campmeeting members read the R&R handbook or discuss the project with a member of the Buildings & Grounds Committee.

### **Sunoco Update**

The second appeal by Concerned Citizens of Lebanon County and 3 township residents of a zoning permit issued to Sunoco Pipeline L.P. for its Mariner East I Pipeline’s Cornwall Pump Station in West Cornwall Township (WCT) will be heard on Friday, April 1, in Lebanon County Common Pleas Court.

The court will hear oral argument concerning the citizens’ appeal of the decision made in September 2015 by the WCT Zoning Hearing Board (ZHB) to dismiss their second zoning challenge due to lack of “standing.” The citizens’

group claims it has “standing” to bring the lawsuit because some of its members live within the “impact zone” of the pump station.

The pump station, located on Rt. 322 near Butler Road, was built in September 2014 to pressurize the highly explosive Natural Gas Liquids – ethane and propane – now transported in the 350-mile 85-year-old pipeline which previously carried gasoline across PA. The citizens appealed the original zoning and related permits issued in 2014 but Sunoco “surrendered” them in April 2015. Because of that unilateral action by Sunoco, a year ago the ZHB dismissed CCLC’s first zoning appeal, calling the case “moot.” Sunoco reapplied for a new zoning permit in April 2015 and the citizens filed its second zoning appeal.

The Concerned Citizens want its appeal of the new zoning permit to be heard because it alleges the permit was issued improperly since Sunoco does not qualify for the public utility exemption in the township’s zoning ordinance and the procedure used violates the PA Constitution’s Environmental Rights Amendment.

### **Campmeeting Tabernacle Rentals**

Looking for a unique spot for a family member’s wedding? Want a sylvan setting for an organizational meeting?

Consider renting the Campmeeting Tabernacle. It seats approximately 700 and includes a sound system.

The Tabernacle is available for rent May through October. Rates differ depending upon the organization type, event and season. For non-profits, the rate is \$250. The for-profit organizations rental rate is \$500.

Weddings have their own rate of \$300.

An extra \$75 is charged to each category for renting the Tabernacle during the off-season (May, September, and October).

A \$50 deposit is required of all rentals along with a Certificate of Insurance (\$500,000). Non-profits must provide a copy of their IRS Letter of Determination.

Note: Rates start at \$250 for any event organized by Campmeeting members and their immediate families.

#### *Pavilion Rental at Heritage Park*

The renovated pavilion next to the bathroom at Heritage Park is available for rental on a first-come, first-served basis. It is available from April through October, 9am to 9 pm. When renting the pavilion, you will be renting the use of the pavilion and the tables under its roof but *not* the surrounding park area or restrooms - the park and restrooms remain available for the use of the general public. ### Board of Managers Urges Campmeeting Members to Know Their Property Lines

The Board of Managers of the Mt. Gretna Campmeeting Association recommends that members interested in selling or improving their cottages check their property lines in order to avoid problems securing mortgages and/or building permits.

Over the years some cottages have inadvertently encroached on land that actually belongs to the Campmeeting or to a neighboring property. While many of these encroachments have not occurred intentionally, they can create problems for members when trying to sell a property or enlarge a cottage.

Examples of recent problems that have occurred as members have tried to sell include: (1) A mortgage provider wanted a survey of a property which showed the cottage was larger than the lot, and (2) Encroachment of a patio on Campmeeting land within the past 21 years. Although rare, these types of problems do occur.

The Board of Managers encourages a member who is selling to know or have their realtor know what their property boundaries are. An official survey will specify the exact dimensions of lots as well as property lines and thereby identify any problematic encroachments.

To address the problems of the above examples, cottage owners can go through the court system to claim "Adverse Possession" to acquire the land or can acquire the land through an easement-purchase process that the Board has implemented. Again, we encourage you and/or your realtor to contact the Campmeeting Office if you have questions or are in doubt.

Members considering external improvements to their properties should keep in mind that an official survey by a Pennsylvania licensed surveyor may be required by the Board of Managers, West Cornwall Township, and Lebanon County. What kinds of external improvements require building permits is spelled out in the recently adopted MGCA Building Permit.

Members also are reminded that all projects in the Campmeeting requiring a building permit from the Lebanon County Planning Department must first be approved by the MGCA Board of Managers.
